

APPLICATION FOR RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENT

Applicants seeking permission to construct/install facilities under, over, adjacent to, or otherwise encroaching upon NCGT’s facilities or right-of-way(s) must complete this application in order to obtain approval. Completed applications will be reviewed in accordance with industry standard practices and may require additional information to appropriately understand and review the nature of the Applicant’s facilities and methods of installation. Completion of this form constitutes an application only and does not grant, imply, guarantee, or otherwise provide the Applicant any permissions or approvals to infringe upon or impact NCGT’s facilities or property rights. Timelines for review are dependent upon the existing backlog of encroachment applications and the Applicant’s thoroughness in complying with NCGT’s minimum requirements.

NCGT reserves the right to require pre- and/or post-construction field inspections and to monitor all construction and installation activities on or in close proximity to its facilities. Applicant understands that, if the project is deemed to require NCGT’s field personnel or third-party field engineers/inspectors on-site, the Applicant may be required to reimburse these costs in order to obtain approval. Depending on the nature of the Applicant’s facilities, execution of a Crossing Agreement specifically detailing the Applicant’s obligations and requirements for encroachment upon NCGT’s facilities may be required.

If it is determined that there is no encroachment in the North Coast Gas Right-of-Way outside of the Public Right-of-Way, the fees may be refunded.

** Initial review only; more complex projects may require additional engineering expertise at an additional cost to the Applicant.

Minimum Requirements for Encroachment

(Failure to meet minimum requirements will result in an automatic denial of the application.)

Design plans/engineered drawings should be submitted electronically in PDF format for efficient processing. If printed plans/drawings must be provided, Applicant must provide at least two sets of plans/drawings. Plans/drawings must provide sufficient information to determine installation and construction will meet NCGT’s minimum requirements. Drawings must be drawn to scale, clearly identify the location of NCGT’s facilities, the area(s) of encroachment, all easement boundaries and property boundaries.

All easement or right-of-way encroachments shall meet the following minimum standards:

- Foreign pipeline crossings shall be installed below NCGT facilities and with minimum clearances as follows:
 - Open Trench – 2’, Convention Bore – 3’, HDD – TBD (5’ minimum TBD)
- All boring and receiving pits shall be outside of NCGT’s right-of-way and clearly marked on the plans/drawings
- Bores shall maintain the approved depths for the entire width of the right-of-way
- Protective measures for any equipment traversing over NCGT pipelines shall be provided (Provide airbridge design and identify crossing locations)
- Parallel occupation within NCGT’s right-of-way is not permitted
